



# **Articulation Agreement between Eastern Oregon University’s BS in Fire Services Administration and Cosumnes River College’s AS in Fire Technology**

The parties to this Articulation Agreement are Cosumnes River College, 8401 Center Parkway, Sacramento, CA 95823, hereinafter referred to as “CRC” and EASTERN OREGON UNIVERSITY, 1 University Blvd, La Grande, OR 97850, hereinafter referred to as “EOU.”

## **Fire Service Administration Bachelor of Science Degree**

Eastern Oregon University’s Bachelor of Science in Fire Service Administration is a liberal arts program designed to give students a strong theoretical background in fire department administration. Graduates in this degree will be prepared for graduate programs in the areas of business administration, public administration, and fire administration. This degree program is offered entirely online and some courses are occasionally available as 2- or 3-day hybrid/onsite courses at various locations in Oregon in cooperation with the Oregon Department of Public Safety Standards and Training (DPSST).

To earn an EOU baccalaureate degree, students must complete the University Graduation Requirements (UGRs) and the program requirements as outlined for each specific major. Students can meet equivalency for subject areas without having taken specific equivalent courses through several options including, but not limited to: NFA or NFPA courses, equivalent courses from other institutions, submission of training records, and/or certifications such as Fire Officer I, etc. Evaluation of equivalency is based upon established, and publicly available, NFA or NFPA training and educational guidelines. The FSA Program Chair will make a final determination of applicability of any proposed equivalency credits.

Specific program content will be reviewed annually, and curriculum changes by either institution must be communicated to the partner institution in writing no later than June 30<sup>th</sup> of each academic year.

Each partner assumes responsibility for informing their students of curricular revisions that would impact student planning and/or degree completion. In event that the graduation requirements for Bachelor’s degree with the Fire Service Administration

Major from EOU change within the term of this agreement, the standards and practices that have been established by EOU to cover such a change will apply to articulating students.

Either party may terminate or suspend this Agreement for convenience upon six (6) months written notice; provided, however, that the parties shall discuss and reasonably attempt to resolve the issues that led to the notice of termination or suspension during the sixty (60) day period. Notwithstanding the termination of this Agreement, any students who have applied for transfer from CRC to EOU prior to or during the six (6) month period shall be treated as if this Agreement continues to be in effect.

Admission to EOU is not guaranteed. Students shall apply for admission to EOU in accordance with the then-existing rules, policies, and procedures of EOU.

This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties. No waiver, consent, modification or change of terms of this agreement shall bind either part unless in writing and signed by both parties. Such waiver, consent, modification, or change, if made, shall be effective only in the specific instance and for the specific purpose given. There are no understandings, agreements or representations, oral or written, not specified herein regarding this agreement.

### **General University Graduation Requirements**

- **180** – minimum credits required to graduate from EOU
- **60** – minimum credits of upper division (300 & 400 level) credits required to graduate from EOU
- **60** – General Education Core credits required to graduate from EOU (see <https://www.eou.edu/registrar/gened/>)
- **45** – minimum credits must be earned from EOU
- **135** – maximum credits that can be transferred to EOU from accredited institutions
- **12** – maximum career and technical education (CTE) elective credits that can be transferred (Fire program credits are exempted)
- **“C-“** – the minimum grade required in courses used to satisfy both Program and General Education requirements

### **Transfer Equivalency**

Credits are awarded for college-level academic courses transferred from an institution accredited by a regional accrediting association. All credits will be transcribed no matter the grade. Any fully admitted student who submits an official transcript from another college or university will have that transcript evaluated and articulated. Courses can transfer into EOU as EOU course equivalencies documented in this agreement.

**\*\*\*With rare exceptions, non-articulated fire science courses will transfer to EOU as lower division transfer (LDT) elective courses per the EOU registrar's office.\*\*\***

NOTE: Most of the credits you earn at other accredited four-year colleges or universities will transfer to EOU. Students with the following Associate degrees from accredited colleges will be considered as having met the general education distribution requirements at EOU:

- A certificate of CSUGE or IGETC from California
