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What is DSPS at CRC?

- Equal Access in the educational setting
 Reasonable Accommodations
 Without altering/changing fundamental aspects of the course
- Eligibility
 Documentation of medical/mental health condition
 IEP or 504 Plan from a secondary school
 Letter from a medical doctor, or psychiatrist/therapist
- Educational Accommodation and Variety of Support Services
- > 100% Optional/Voluntary

DSPS Accommodations

- Shared Notes for Lectures
- ASL Sign Language Interpreting
- Captioning
- Test Accommodations e.g.Extended time tests/quizzes
- Audio Recording of Lectures
- Alternate Media Formats
- Assistive Technology Lab
- Adaptive Furniture & Equipment

This list does note reflect all possible accommodations

Support Services

- Priority Registration
- Specialized Counseling
- Specialized Instruction
- Assessment for Learning Disability
- Assistive Technology Training
- Referral to on campus and community resources

DSPS Process & Steps

Apply Online for DSPS & Upload Verification

DSPS Application - https://crc.losrios.edu/dsps
Verification - IEP, 504 or Medical Documentation
DSPS Disability Verification Form
DSPS is separate and confidential at each college

- Schedule an intake appointment with DSPS Counselor
 - Eligibility for Services
 Academic Accommodation Plan (AAP)*
 Student Education Plan
- Follow up Appointment Accommodation Letters

DSPS Title 5

Accommodation Letters

- Meet with DSPS Counselor to identify accommodations & get letters
- Letters inform professors of accommodations only -Not Disability
- Every Semester = New Class = New Letter
- Request letters before semester starts preferred
- Discuss accommodations with your class professors
- During remote operations letters are provided in electronic format

Test Proctoring

Instructor/Student needs to reach out to
Coordinator/Staff

Note Taking

- Accommodation—If approved
- Accommodation letter informs professor
- Professor makes notetaker announcement
 - Student can identify a peer for shared notes
- Volunteer notetaker signs up with DSPS
- Alternatively professors can provide slides/notes

Alternate Media

- Same Content—Different Format
- Audio Books
- E-Text/E-Books (Word/PDF Files)
- Large Print
- Braille

How is College Different from High School?

- IEP vs AAP (Academic Accommodation Plan)
- Student applies & provides disability verification
- Self-Identify
- Self-Advocacy
- No Special Education: No separate classes
 - Accommodations—No Modifications
 Same Standards & Same Learning Outcomes
- More Independent Learning

Student Rights

- 1. DSPS is entirely voluntary/optional.

Overall/Cumulative GPA Below 2.0 – one semester

*Warning *May require Success Workshop attendance

Academic Probation or Progress II

GPA below 2.0 – two semesters

*Impacts Priority 0 Registration *May affect Financial Aid

Academic & Progress Dismissal

3rd Semester - Meet with Counselor to make a plan

 Earned 24 units
 GPA 3.1 or above
