





### HAWK CARES PROGRAM

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#### THE ISSUE



- In 2019, nearly 167,000 students responded to the #RealCollege survey:
  - 39% of students were food insecure in the prior 30 days
  - 46% of students were housing insecure in the previous year\*
  - 17% of students were homeless in the previous year

- In 2019, more than 23,000 parenting students responded to the #RealCollege survey:
  - 53% of parenting students were food insecure in the prior 30 days
  - 68% of parenting students were housing insecure in the previous year
  - 17% of parenting students were homeless in the previous year

- Started off small, grass roots efforts
- Conducted surveys
- Joined #RealCollegeCalifornia Network
- Discussed resources needed to address issue (space, funding, staffing)

#### The Hawk Spot (Food Pantry)

- Partnership with Sac Food Bank
- Open three days a week
- Fresh produce on Thursdays

#### The Hawk Swap (Clothes Closet)

 Provided access to new or gently used clothing to students in need

#### Gowns for Grads

 Created by the CRC Alumni Association to provide students with access to graduation caps and gowns



## During COVID-19



#### Grocery Gift Cards

- March: \$25 grocery cards sent to 100 students (\$2500)
- Mid-August: 440 e-cards sent to 295 students (Hunger Free Grant)

#### Emergency Hotel Program

• Established relationship with Extended Stay America

#### Home for Hawks

 Partnership with Lutheran Social Services and Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency

#### Food Distribution Drive-Ups

- Our last day on campus, before the closure, we provided nearly 100 bags of food to students
- On November 6<sup>th</sup>, we plan on providing nearly 400 bags of food to students

- Through partnership, created LSS Case Manager/Hawk Cares Advocate
  - Housed at CRC
- Provided 10 housing vouchers to CRC students between the ages of 18-24
- Provides case management for three years








- Provides expertise in locating housing and service provision to students
